{MISSION}

Making the lives of pigs and pugs happier and healthier.

{PROGRAMMING}

Tranquil Space Foundation's (TSF) signature program, Pigs & Pugs Project, continues to grow and raise awareness of pigs and pugs, host events, and provide micro grants to pig sanctuaries and pug rescues in need.



Our spring (April) event Pigs, Pugs, and Pinot with special guest Charlotte the potbelly pig sold-out at Tyber Creek Wine Bar in Washington, DC. [Humane Rescue Alliance](#) joined us with adoptable cats and dogs. We raised \$1299 and have donated \$900 to [Life with Pigs Farm Sanctuary](#) and \$400 to [Homeward Bound Pug Rescue](#).



In the summer we hosted our annual Yoa and the Animals (June) at Burleigh Manor Animal Sanctuary. We raised \$1650 — \$1090 for [Burleigh Manor Animal Sanctuary](#) and \$560 for [our micro-grants](#).

\$1090 covers care and feeding of one pig YEAR and \$560 helps us provide micro-grants to four pig sanctuaries and pug rescues in need.



In the fall we hosted Pugs and Pints (October) at The Brig. [Humane Rescue Alliance](#). Through these three events, we raised \$4049 for pig sanctuaries and pug rescues.

{GRANTS}

In 2019, TSF gave \$5,940 to pig sanctuaries and pug rescues in need. Since the shift to animal welfare programming in 2016, TSF has given \$16,000 in micro grants that have helped organizations dealing with a medical crisis, hoarding cases, natural disasters, and more.
